



Based in the heart of Manhattan, Sirens of Gotham is a fresh take on women's a cappella. Performing a variety of genres ranging from barbershop to contemporary pop to classical to vocal jazz, the Sirens take pride in performing all kinds of a cappella music.

Sirens of Gotham has accomplished much since its establishment in November of 2011, but has grown exponentially since February 2013, when the ensemble became a chartered chapter of the world's largest music education organization for women: Sweet Adelines International (SAI).

Since then, the Sirens have become the SAI Region 15 Division A Champions, taken 3rd place in the 2015 New York Harmony Sweepstakes, appeared on multiple televised broadcasts, starred in a television show, performed in various world-renowned venues, produced their own live performances, and hosted a multitude of successful fundraisers.

Since the chorus' founding in 2008, VoG has rapidly distinguished itself as one of the country's leading incubators of both new barbershop music, and of young musical artists who will shape the continuing evolution and excellence of the barbershop tradition. VoG is ranked by the BHS as one of the top ten barbershop choruses worldwide. With over 85 members and growing, VoG is a dues-paying organization that includes high school and college students, professional actors and musicians, and men of all walks of life who simply enjoy raising their voices in song.

STEPHANIE OFSHINSKY - Associate Music Director, Sirens of Gotham



Stephanie Ofshinsky received a Bachelor of Arts in Musical Theatre and a Masters of Arts in Teaching in Music Education from Manhattanville College. She currently works in the Cresskill School District where she teaches music, theater, and dance, works with instrumental and vocal ensembles, is the Tri-M Music Honor Society Co-Advisor, Principal Players School Musical Choreographer, and Fall Drama Director.

Stephanie's studies in the performing arts have taken her to New Jersey, New York, Texas, Florida, Canada, England, and

back. She is an accomplished seamstress and vocal artist, having performed as both a soloist and ensemble member. She is also a current front row member of the Harmony Celebration Chorus (SAI). As a private voice teacher she believes that from a young age we incorporate music into how we learn as well as how we play, and throughout our school years we are asked to develop our listening and creative skills. Music becomes an important part of our daily lives, and whether you are pursuing a career in the arts or just want to impress your friends at a party, good vocal technique can make all the difference. She truly believes that everyone can sing, but sometimes you need a guiding hand to help you find your voice.

Our Programs

Arrangers' Lab

The Arrangers' Lab is Voices of Gotham's resident collective of composers who create and arrange new music in the barbershop harmony and contemporary a cappella styles. Already educated in significant university music programs, they apply their skills toward the study of the barbershop tradition and the ongoing development of its pedagogy and repertoire.

In addition to providing Voices of Gotham and its affiliated quartets with custom material, the Arrangers' Lab also leads an ongoing Barbershop Arranging Workshop for members of the chorus at large. In the workshop, participants study existing barbershop arrangements, learn basic theory and composition, and gain insight and feedback on their work.



Tin Pan Alley Novice Quartet Contest

Tin Pan Alley is an annual free, public event hosted by Voices of Gotham which brings new quartets to compete in front of both an audience and a panel of certified judges from the Barbershop Harmony Society.. TPA fosters choral excellence by encouraging barbershop quartet singing, developing quality singers, educating contestants



and spectators on the history of barbershop in New York City, and mobilizing the Arrangers' Lab to produce brand new arrangements. Quartets of all types can participate--all-male, all-female, and mixed--and many that begin here go on to compete in formal competitions.

Community Initiatives

Harmony With Heart

Our Harmony with Heart Program brings free or subsidized barbershop harmony performances to traditionally underserved and/or marginalized communities, including senior assisted-living homes and community centers, transitional housing, and children's hospital wards.



Gotham Gives

Gotham Gives is the service arm of our organizations, aimed at giving back to the community beyond song. Projects have included cleaning up Seward Park Garden and partnering with New York Cares to renovate Adrian Hegeman Elementary School.





About the Directors

BILL STAUFFER - Director, Voices of Gotham



Bill Stauffer is a musician, composer, and music educator, as well as a lifelong barbershop performer, arranger, and clinician. In addition to Voices of Gotham, he also directs the Sweet Adelines International (SAI) Capitaland Chorus.

As a long-time member of the Barbershop Harmony Society Harmony College East staff, Bill has instructed workshops in vocal technique, choral directing, and youth choruses. Prior to joining Gotham, he directed multiple BHS choruses, including the Dapper Dans of Harmony, the Jerseyaires, and the Gold Standard Chorus.

Bill also has substantial professional experience in community mobilization for both religious and secular not-for-profit organizations. These efforts have fostered arts education and employment training programs in low income and inner city neighborhoods, as well as the production of an annual choral concert series.

Bill received his music education training from Westminster Choir College. He is the proud father of twins, a son and daughter.

MATT GALLAGHER - Associate Director, Voices of Gotham



Matt Gallagher has been barbershopping for 28 years and is proud to be a member of Voices of Gotham. He also recently became a member of the Atlantic and Northeastern Harmony Brigades. As a professional musician, Matt has conducted several Broadway musicals, most recently: Newsies, The Book of Mormon, and Rock of Ages.

What is barbershop?

Barbershop vocal harmony is a style of a cappella close harmony, or unaccompanied vocal music, characterized by consonant four-part chords for every melody note in a predominantly homophonic texture. Each of the four parts has its own role: generally, the lead sings the melody, the tenor harmonizes above the melody, the bass sings the lowest harmonizing notes, and the baritone completes the chord, usually below the lead.

Except for the bass, the voice parts in barbershop singing do not correspond closely to their classical music counterparts; the tenor range and tessitura are similar to those of the classical countertenor, the baritone resembles lyric baritone in range and a tenor in tessitura, and the lead generally corresponds to the tenor of classical repertoire, with some singers possessing a tessitura more similar to that of a high baritone. Barbershop singing is performed both by men's and women's groups; the elements of the barbershop style and the names of the voice parts are the same for both.

Barbershop Organizations

Barbershop Harmony Society



Founded by O.C. Cash and Rupert Hall in Tulsa, OK in 1938, the Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS) is the first of several organizations to promote and preserve barbershop harmony among men of all ages. North America is divided into several districts, including the Mid-Atlantic District (MAD) which includes areas of New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. Voices of Gotham has won the MAD chorus championship in 2012 and 2014.



Sweet Adelines International

A parallel women's singing organization, Sweet Adelines International (SAI), was founded in 1945 by Edna Mae Manderson of Tulsa, Oklahoma. The aim was to teach and train women in music and to create and promote barbershop quartets and other musical groups. Areas throughout the world are divided into several regions, including Region 15, which covers the Greater New York and New Jersey area. Sirens of Gotham won the Region 15 Division A championship in 2015.
