DR. DAVID WRIGHT — Dr. David Wright is one of the most prolific barbershop arrangers on the scene today. His arrangements are performed by groups such as Vocal Spectrum, The Gas House Gang, The Westminster Chorus, and countless a cappella groups inside and outside of barbershop. Although his specialty is barbershop close harmony, David's work integrates jazz, blues, gospel, country, doowop, and contemporary a cappella. He serves as Associate Director of the three-time International Champion Chorus, The Ambassadors of Harmony, leading the chorus from 1981–1990, and he has served for over 30 years as a judge in barbershop competitions. In addition to his work as an arranger, David is one of the current authorities on the history of the barbershop style. He has taught the *History of Barbershop* course at Harmony University since 1986 and has been at the forefront of promoting a renewed historical understanding of barbershop harmony. He serves as chair of the Department of Mathematics at Washington University in St. Louis where he teaches a course on music and mathematics, and recently presented on the subject of mathematics and tuning in barbershop music. www.math.wustl.edu/~wright/

Since then, they have become the 2015 SAI Region 15 Division A Champions (Second Place 2013 and 2014), placed Third in the 2015 New York Harmony Sweepstakes, appeared on television, performed in various venues, produced their own show, Gotham Follies, and hosted the successful soiree fundraiser La Nuit Rouge. DA CAPO – Da Capo is an award-winning a cappella quartet hailing from the Washington, D.C. area. In April of 2011, Da Capo competed in a regional a cappella competition in Washington, D.C. where the group ranked 1st and was voted "Audience Favorite." Da Capo represented the Mid-Atlantic Region at the Harmony Sweepstakes National Finals in San Francisco, CA in May of 2011, where they earned the title 2011 Harmony Sweepstakes National Champions. In July of 2011, Da Capo competed in their first International Barbershop competition, ranking 14th in the world. The quartet was also awarded The Dealers Choice Award, which is given to the highest scoring new quartet in the competition. In 2013, Da Capo became an International Quartet Finalist, ranking among the top ten quartets at the International Barbershop Quartet Contest. Da Capo has had the privilege to perform at prestigious events including the National Christmas Tree Lighting at President's Park in Washington, D.C., with Kevin Spacey for the Spacey Foundation Gala, and alongside Grammy award-winning groups Pentatonix and The Manhattan Transfer. www.dcsingers.com
